

## LINKed Pathway to ECU

Prendiville Catholic College (PCC) and Edith Cowan College (ECC) - the alternative pathway to Edith Cowan University (ECU).

The LINKed Pathway to ECU via ECC's Diploma courses will help prepare students for a successful transition to University life and study. Students accepted into the LINKed Pathway may study General or ATAR courses, or a combination of both. The LINKed Pathway is designed for students who are capable of University study, but who are not suited to ATAR or may not meet pre-requisites to study a full ATAR load in Years 12.

Students will progress to ECC's Diploma if they achieve a minimum 50% in four Year 12 WACE courses, plus a pass (C grade) in English.
