








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The Prendiville Way

 - Year group time social and emotional learning & year events







Conduct Statements

- 1. You act safely and competently.
- 2. You give priority to students' safety and well-being in all your behaviour
 - and decision making.
- 3. You act in accordance with the values of the Gospel as defined in the Code of Ethical Conduct.
- 4. You conduct yourself in accordance with laws, agreements, policies and
 - standards relevant to your relationship with the school community.



WHAT WE ASK OF YOU...

1. Be CURIOUS. When issues arise, find out all of the details.

- Don't automatically believe everything your child says about school.

2. TRUST us to educate & care for your child \rightarrow This is our *vocation*.

- You know your child the best, but we know about children in community.

3. Be willing to **COMMUNICATE** with us \rightarrow both positives & concerns.

- The best communication flows both ways in a constructive manner.

4. Remember always to **ROLE MODEL** the behaviour that you want to see from your children.

- We take this aspect very seriously. Adults are constantly 'on show' to younger people.

5. Please show **RESPECT** to our school, our staff and our processes.

- You don't have to always agree with us - but be mindful how you express this.


